

**ANC3E Meeting
Minutes of October 11, 2001**

Chairperson Jill Diskan called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Commissioners Chris McNamara, Leslie Quynn, Tad DiBiase and Frank Gordon were present.

Announcements:

The ANC would be accepting grant applications until the November meeting. Presentation of grants will be made at the November meeting and awards presented in December.

DPS will be conducting a household Hazardous Waste Collection Day for District residents on Saturday, October 13. The event will be held at RFK Stadium parking lot #6 from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m.

DCPS has established a September 11th DCPS Memorial Fund. Contributions should be sent to: September 11th DCPS Memorial Fund, P.O. Box 93340, Washington D.C. 20090-2240.

A neighborhood garage and bake sale will be held on Saturday, October 13 and Sunday, October 14 at 41st and Ellicott Streets. The sale is being held as a fundraiser to restore peace, order and quiet to the neighborhood and proceeds will help to meet legal costs.

Tad announced he had formed a Hechinger Building Task Force. The purpose of the task force is to relay concerns to the developers. Interested parties should contact him at (202) 246-2083.

ANC Business:

The minutes of the September 2001 meeting were unanimously approved.

Open Forum:

A resident expressed concern that the day program at Friendship Place was not operating effectively as many of the clients were often seen on the streets during the day.

Commissioner DiBiase noted that the program was generally considered successful and maintained a professional staff.

The same resident inquired if any further information was available on the tower on Wisconsin Avenue.

Commissioner DiBiase stated the American Tower Corporation will file an appeal with the D.C. Superior Court.

Bob Mulderig, the parent of a child at Chevy Chase Plaza Children's Center stated that one or two parents of children attending the school would be regularly attending ANC 3E meetings. He noted that Chevy Chase Plaza was interested in expanding their site.

Don McMullin asked the Commission if the Citizen Summit had been considered a success.

Commission chair Diskan described the daylong summit and commented on the organization of the event but noted she was unsure of the success of plans for the Neighborhood Cluster.

Steve Posiak mentioned the article on the Citizen Summit in the most recent City Paper.

Presentation by 2nd District Police

There was no presentation by the 2nd District Police.

Presentation and vote of most recent proposal for former Hechinger site

There was no presentation by Madison Retail.

Commissioner DiBiase gave an overview of the project as presented at the September 13th, 2001 meeting.

A resident asked if the building would be developed within a reasonable time frame.

Commissioner DiBiase stated that he was confident the development would stay on schedule due to the financial urgency of the project.

Commissioner DiBiase moved to support the concept of the building being converted to mixed use as presented at the September 2001 ANC 3E meeting.

Commissioner Gordon seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously. (A copy of this resolution is attached to the minutes).
