

ANC 3E Meeting
Minutes of June 9, 2005

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 p.m. Commissioners Amy McVey, Chapman Todd, Lucy Eldridge and Anne Sullivan were present.

ANC Business/Actions:

The following checks were approved:

Check number 1201 to Verizon for Telephone Services

Check number 1203 to Polly King for Consulting Services

The Commission unanimously approved the following:

- To protest the application of World Market Ms. Eldridge the authority to negotiate a voluntary agreement to be included in the application. Commissioner Sullivan seconded the motion and the motion passes 4-0.
- To table the vote on the temporary closure of the sidewalk at the Tenley Library.

Announcements:

The chief financial officer of Georgetown Day School, Kate Lindsey, announced that the school will be contacting immediate neighbors of the school to video their basements and that the school would be sending out a schedule of community meetings to begin on Friday, July 4th, 2005 so that residents could remain informed about the school's addition during the construction process. She asked that concerns and questions be directed to her at 202-295-6100. Commissioner Todd stressed the need to develop a construction agreement between GDS and ANC 3E before the next meeting.

At the request of a resident regarding the River Road barrier Commissioner Todd updated the community on D.D.O.T.'s plan to hold a meeting by the end of the month (June 29th, 2005) so that concerned residents could voice opinions about the barrier and make suggestions for additional traffic calming measures.

Chairperson McVey announced that ANC 3E grants would not be released in the Spring of 2005

Presentation by 2nd District Police:

Lt Aiello reviewed the crime statistics for PSA 2002 for the past 30 days and updated residents about recent arrests. Commissioner Todd asked about the latest enforcement efforts on River Road. Lt. Aiello commented that the reports indicate that there are sufficient incidents of speeding to warrant a police presence on River Road. Several residents complained about the valet parking at Maggiano's Restaurant on Wisconsin Avenue and Commissioner Eldridge agreed to meet with the owners to try to work on an agreement between them.

Introduction by Vickie Gersten of Jonah's Treehouse, a Child's Play and Movement Company, opening in Glover Park

Ms. Gersten described the curriculum of Jonah's Treehouse, an innovative play and movement center for children of ages four months to four years. Classes will begin in September 2005 and the facility is located at 2121 Wisconsin Avenue. For more information about the center and to registrar for classes go www.jonahstreehouse.com.

Discussion of and possible vote on application of World Market to open at Chevy Chase Pavilion:

Commissioner Eldridge reviewed an outline of a volunteer agreement between World Market and ANC 3E. Commissioner Eldridge stated that it was in the community's best interest to registrar a protest against World Market so as to ensure that the voluntary agreement would be included in their application to open at Chevy Chase Pavilion. Several residents noted the store would generate additional traffic and parking issues and that they would like to see this issue addressed in the voluntary agreement. Commissioner Eldridge proposed a motion to file a protest against the application and that the Commission give Ms. Eldridge the authority to negotiate a voluntary agreement to be included in the application. Commissioner Sullivan seconded the motion and the motion passed 4-0.

Discussion of and possible vote on the temporary closure of the sidewalk at the Tenley Library:

Commissioner Todd moved to table the vote on the temporary closure of the sidewalk at the Tenley Library. Chairperson McVey seconded the motion and the motion passed 4-0.

There being no further business, the meeting ended at 9:00 p.m.
