

ANC 3E Meeting
Minutes of October 13, 2005

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. Commissioners Amy McVey, Chapman Todd, Lucy Eldridge, Amy Hoang Wrona and Anne Sullivan were present.

ANC Business/Actions:

The following checks were approved:

Announcements:

Commissioner Sullivan announced that a Household Hazardous Waste Collection would be held at Carter Barron Amphitheatre on Saturday, October 22, 2005. Commissioner Todd announced that a public meeting will be held during the first week of November to discuss the study results of the River Road barrier and the dates of the public meetings to discuss the Wisconsin Avenue Corridor Traffic Study would be announced during the second week of November. Commissioner Eldridge gave an update on the Fort Reno playing fields.

Open Forum:

Mr. Scott commended DDOT for the work underway at Tenley Circle. A local resident reviewed current projects for the city's treescape sponsored by the Casey Trees Endowment Fund.

Presentation by 2nd District Police:

Lt Aiello reviewed the crime statistics for PSA 202 for the past 30 days. He also announced that the US Attorney's Community Prosecution Office would be holding a Community Forum on Property Crimes on Wednesday, October 26, 2005 from 6:30 p.m. to 7: 00 p.m.

Discussion and vote of an application for a special exception to allow a second-story addition to an existing single story detached dwelling at 4659 Massachusetts Ave. NW

Carol Anderson presented a petition signed by immediate neighbors in support of her application for a special exception for a second-story addition at 4659 Massachusetts Avenue. There being no objection to the application Chairperson McVey moved to

support the motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Hoang Wrona. The motion passed 5-0.

Discussion and vote on application for a driveway and curb cut at 4207 Chesapeake Street NW

The Commission heard from the owner of 4207 Chesapeake Street NW regarding an application for a proposed driveway and lead construction. Immediate neighbors voiced support of the application. The being no objection Commissioner Todd moved to support the motion, which was seconded by Chairperson McVey. The motion passed 5-0.

Commissioner Todd moved to oppose the construction of a fence at 4632 Wisconsin Avenue until the Commission had a chance to review the plans at the November 2005 meeting. Chairperson McVey seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0

Update from Councilmember Kathy Patterson's office on the Tenleytown Library

Penny Pagano, chief of staff for Kathy Patterson, addressed the status of the contract between the DC Government and the four libraries that the city has plans to modernize as well as future plans for the Tenleytown Library. The Office of Procurement is currently reviewing whether to go forward with the existing contact for four of the city's libraries, or to award additional funds for the project. Regarding future plans for the libraries; the Council has approved \$2.8 million from fiscal year 2005 reserve funds for the DC Library to open a temporary storefront library in Tenleytown and the three other locations. Ms. Pagano emphasized that Kathy Patterson was working closely with the DC Public Library, the Friends of the Tenley Library and others on this project to ensure that it continues to serve the neighborhood. Ms. Pagano urged the Commission to consider the current design plan for the library, and let her office know if they would like to go ahead with the existing design or to entertain a new design for the site. She also asked for input regarding sites for a temporary storefront library in the neighborhood.

Commissioner Todd reviewed DDOT plans and neighborhood suggestions for the River Road/Fessenden Barrier.
