

Bon Secours Resolution

- Whereas:** The property located at 4101 Yuma Street is within the boundary of ANC 3E.
- Whereas:** The building is one of the most prominent buildings in Tenleytown, American University Park and Friendship Heights.
- Whereas:** The building was known as the Bon Secours Convent until it was purchased by the Height's (sp) Foundation which operated the building first as the French School and later as Oakcrest School for Girls until it recently became vacant.
- Whereas:** The current property owner is proposing to add an addition to the building so that they can open a Woman's Educational Center.
- Whereas:** The Tenleytown Historical Society has applied for a application for land marking the Bon Secours Convent at 4101 Yuma Street.
- Whereas:** The plan to add an addition will not be impeded by the historic landmark.
- Be It Resolved:** The commissioners of ANC 3E ask that the Historic Preservation Board look favorably on Tenleytown Historical Society's application to dedicate Bon Secours Convent in the D.C. Inventory of Historic Sites.

ANC 3-E approved this resolution at its regular meeting on November 12, 2003, which was properly noticed and at which a quorum was present. The resolution was approved by a vote of 3-0. Commissioners Chapman Todd, Lucy Eldridge, Amy McVey and Amy Hoang and were present.
