2. Project Information

Name of Project:

Second District 2015 MPD Citizens Advisory Council's Awards Banquet – Award Plaques

Description of Project:

The annual awards banquet, which began in 2007, honors police officers and citizens in the Second Police District who have done an outstanding job combating crime or helping with the overall public safety mission in the district. Nearly 400 police officers serve the Second District and its more than 138,000 residents, encompassing most of northwest Washington, DC, including the neighborhoods of American University Park, Friendship Heights, and Tenleytown.

The 2015 banquet will take place on September 30 from 6:30 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. at Maggiano's Little Italy restaurant in Friendship Heights. The 2D CAC is seeking a grant from Advisory Neighborhood Commission 3E in the amount of \$750 toward the purchase of award plaques given to each honoree.

The Second District is fortunate to have some of the most dedicated officers in the police department, the majority of whom work long hours often with little thanks to ensure the safety of local residents, businesses, and visitors. The banquet is the one opportunity each year for the leadership of the Second District MPD and members of the community to recognize individual officers and residents who have gone above and beyond the call of duty. Awards include: Captain of the Year, Lieutenant of the Year, Sergeant of the Year, Vice Officer of the Year, Detective of the Year, Officer of the Year for each of the eight Police Service Areas (PSAs), Traffic Officer of the Year, Footbeat Officer of the Year, Reserve Officer of the Year, Administrative Officer of the Year, Civilian of the Year, Community Service Awards, Commander's Choice Award, CAC Special Honorees, and 2D Officer of the Year.

Police officers being honored at the event, their families, and fellow officers greatly appreciate the community's and department's recognition of their work. The event is attended by senior members of the police department, DC Councilmembers, community associations representing neighborhoods in the Second District, businesses in the Second District, and local residents.

The Citizens Advisory Council is an advisory panel in each police district that provides the district commander with information and recommendations from the community on the public's safety problems and police service needs.

Where will additional funds needed to complete the project come from?

2D CAC is also requesting grant support from ANC 3F to provide for the additional funds needed to purchase award plaques for banquet honorees. In addition, local businesses, community associations, and residents throughout the Second District provide financial support to help cover the other costs of holding the banquet.

Describe the benefits to the residents of ANC 3E.

Residents of the neighborhoods within the boundaries of ANC 3E, including AU Park, Friendship Heights, and Tenleytown, are served by the officers of the Second District, as are the numerous local businesses and countless visitors. ANC 3E's neighborhoods are recognized as among the safest in the city, due in no small part to the ongoing work of MPD and the Second District's partnership with the community. While ANC 3E's boundaries generally coincide with PSA 202, the community is not just served by current PSA 202 officers. Police throughout the district are called upon to deploy across PSAs as needs arise, and during the year officers' assignments within the district may change based upon seniority. While the PSA 202 Officer of the Year certainly served in this community, it is very likely that an officer being honored for work in another PSA or capacity previously served PSA 202, as well. The annual awards banquet not only recognizes the exemplary work of members of the police department, but also demonstrates ongoing community support for those working in the Second District. The event contributes toward positive relations between citizens and the police, and fosters goodwill.


The below budget is based upon 2014 actual costs for the purchase of award plaques, plus projected minimal inflation.
