Re: Notification for the Installation of Neighborhood Bikeways on Jenifer St NW and 41st St NW

Notice# 13-87-PPSA

Dear Commissioner Bender:

Pursuant to the “Administrative Procedure Amendment Act of 2000” D.C. LAW 13-249 (48 DCR 3491 April 20, 2001), the District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is required to give a written notice of our intent to modify traffic and/or parking requirements. This letter is being forwarded to you for the purpose of notification and solicitation of comments on our intent to implement the following in your jurisdiction:

Neighborhood Bikeways on Jenifer St NW (Western Ave to Nebraska Ave NW) and 41st Street NW (Wisconsin Ave to Western Ave NW).

Both of these signed bicycle corridors are recommendations from the *Rock Creek West 2 Livability Study*, and the *2005 Bike Master Plan*, respectively. They will provide a valuable east-west and north-south connection for cyclists. Attached please find the proposed plans.

Existing automobile and parking lanes will not be affected. Shared lane symbols “sharrows” would be placed in travel lanes notifying drivers to expect bicyclists in the roadway, and way finding signage would be installed to provide destination and distance information along the Neighborhood Bikeway route. These are important bicycle connections between neighborhoods and destinations in and around northwest DC, and connect cyclists to the larger bicycle network. This project is part of a citywide initiative to make bicycling safer and more convenient

All comments on this subject matter must be filed in writing, not later than thirty days (30) after the date of this notice, with the District Department of Transportation. Comments should be submitted
