PROJECT OVERVIEW

At Pepco, we are committed to providing safe, reliable, and affordable energy to our customers and communities in the District of Columbia. As part of this commitment, in 2011 we began an upgrade and modernization of the Harrison Street Substation at 5210 Wisconsin Avenue, NW. The Substation has been operating safely and reliably for more than 70 years. While the facility has undergone regular maintenance and upgrades over the years, the infrastructure and some of the equipment are nearing the end of their intended service life and require upgrades.

STRENGTHENING SYSTEMS & PREPARING FOR GROWTH

The modernization of Harrison Street Substation will enhance reliability and prepare for the community's growing energy needs. This work will also improve the aesthetics of the building by enclosing the substation to conceal equipment and upgrading the façade of the building along the 5200 block of Wisconsin Avenue, NW.

IMPACTS ON THE COMMUNITY

We understand that work in your neighborhood can cause disruption such as parking restrictions, and Pepco will work to minimize impacts to residents and the community. We are coordinating with the District of Columbia's Department of Transportation to create traffic control plans to ensure the public and workers are safe while keeping disruption to a minimum. Parking restrictions and lane closures will occur only during work hours and proper flagging and signage will be used to minimize traffic delays. Pepco will begin work in your area in mid-October 2018 and continue through February 2019. Our expected work hours will be Monday through Friday, 10 pm to 3 am. Customer outages will not be necessary.

PROJECT ACTIVITY

Crews will install approximately 1,000 feet of conduit on Wisconsin Avenue between Harrison and Jenifer Streets. We will also resize nine manholes and install one manhole in front of the substation at 5210 Wisconsin Avenue. Work will affect

the entire street area in front of the substation as well as the northbound lane between Harrison and Jenifer. Work will occur in phases.

Customers can expect to see Pepco personnel working in manholes and on the street. As crews work we ask customers to remain clear of worksites so that crews may work safely and efficiently. We appreciate your patience as we complete this important work to improve service in your community.
