Dear Resident of the 4300 block of Harrison Street, NW:

At Pepco, we are committed to providing safe, reliable, affordable and sustainable energy to our customers and communities in the District of Columbia.


As part of this commitment and in connection with the ongoing work at the Harrison Substation, we are writing to provide some information about work that will be occurring at the substation as well as in the area, beginning this weekend, Saturday, February 23 and Sunday, February 24 and throughout March and April.

- The work on Saturday (2/23) and Sunday, (2/24) will occur during the day between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. and involves the final stages of assembling three power transformers. This work began earlier in the week, but has been scheduled for completion over the weekend, including both Saturday and Sunday, due to the recent winter storm. The work this weekend will involve assembly of a transformer farthest from your property so as to lessen any disturbance to you and your neighbors.
- Beginning Monday, February 25, and continuing through late-April, Pepco will perform conduit and manhole work relating to the substation at different locations along the 5200 block of Wisconsin Avenue. The work will be performed from 9 p.m. to 4 a.m. to avoid disturbance to the businesses in the area. We do not anticipate that noise from the work will travel to nearby residential areas.
- Beginning Friday, March 1st and lasting until Tuesday, March 12th, Pepco will work to achieve a vacuum inside the transformers and fluid-fill them. This work involves vacuuming and filling the three transformers at the substation with oil. These activities must be completed continuously and, therefore, work will occur 24 hours a day once it begins. Prior to the work beginning, Pepco employees and contractors on-site will be briefed on noise restrictions in place due to the residential surroundings. The equipment that will be used on-site to complete this work should produce a low-level sound.

We understand that this work can be disruptive and will use all efforts to mitigate the impact as much as possible. As we complete this work, we ask that you remain clear of the worksites so that crews may work safely and efficiently.
